

#### WSIS Forum 2023, OPENING CEREMONY

What we've learned over the last 20 years must serve to help us to accelerate the progress to achieve the SDGs.

The WSIS Action Lines and SDGs are inextricably linked, and we are in a race against time.



#### **UNGA Resolution 70/125**

...and we call for close alignment between the World Summit on the Information Society process and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, 2 highlighting the crosscutting contribution of information and communications technology to the Sustainable Development Goals and poverty eradication, and noting that access to information and communications technologies has also become a development indicator and aspiration in and of itself.

#### **G77 Havana Declaration**

We reaffirm the 2005 Tunis Agenda for the Information Society in which the special and specific funding needs of the developing world were recognized and encourage close alignment between the World Summit on the Information Society process and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, highlighting the cross-cutting contributions of information and communications technology to the Sustainable Development Goals, in particular the eradication of poverty in all its forms and dimensions, and noting that access to information and communications technologies has also become a development indicator and aspiration in and of itself.

We also call for a close correspondence of the World Summit on the Information Society process with the Addis Ababa Action Agenda and other outcomes of relevant intergovernmental processes, including the Global Digital Compact and the Summit of the Future. We agree to work towards a strong and concerted position of the G-77 and China to ensure that the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS+20) General Review process, the Global Digital Compact and the Summit of the Future contribute to, inter alia, the achievement of sustainable development and closing the digital divide between developed and developing countries.














## **WSIS+20 Preparatory Process**
